SCORM

SCORM stands for Shareable Content Object Reference Model and is a set of specifications for developing, packaging and delivering training content whenever and wherever they are needed. SCORM compliance makes sure that the resources are reusable, accessible, interoperable and durable.

Examples of SCORM compliant software include Hot Potatoes, Camtasia, Adobe Captivate, Flash and Dreamweaver. Tutors sometimes create content in one of these packages and import them into a Moodle course for you to use.

After the SCORM content is imported into Moodle, it is referred to as a SCORM package. SCORM packages display much like Moodle books with a table of contents and previous and next icons for navigation. They can be launched directly from Moodle without requiring any additional software to run them.
