









Adobe Connect Roles

Your role will have been set by the Adobe Connect room host (in most cases this is the Module Leader). Each role has different permissions. Very tiny icons in the **Attendees pod** enable you to identify the different roles each attendee has and whether they are connecting from a mobile device. If they are connecting from a mobile device this may reduce their ability to participate in certain activities (such as screen sharing). It is recommended that hosts do not connect from mobile devices.

Yellow icons are logged in attendees and blue icons are guest attendees. Hosts are holding microphones  or  and presenters have presentation screens behind them  or . Participants have no devices  or . Those attendees connecting with mobile devices have mobile devices in front of them  or . These can also be yellow if they are logged in.

Hosts can:

- Set up a room
- Add content to the room library
- Share content
- Add or edit layouts in a room
- Promote participants to the role of host or presenter
- Give extra permissions to a participant without promoting them to host or presenter
- Start and stop broadcasting audio and video
- Create and manage breakout rooms
- Perform all of the activities that presenters and participants can

Presenters can:

- Share content already loaded into the meeting room from the library by the host
- Share content from their PCs
- Share their screen with all attendees
- Chat
- Broadcast live audio and video
- Mute audio broadcasts on their PCs

Logged in participants can:

- View the content that the presenter or host is sharing
- See and hear the presenter/host's audio and video broadcast
- Use text chat
- Mute audio broadcasts on their PCs

Guest participants can:

- View the content that the presenter or host is sharing
- See and hear the presenter/host's audio and video broadcast
- Use text chat
- Mute audio broadcasts on their PCs
