

How to find E-journals by title (Full Text Finder service)

The E-journals by title A-Z list **enables you to check the availability of the journal title** when you have the full details of a journal including author, date, article title, journal title, volume number, issue and pages. If you need to do a **subject search** or look up **articles by title**, search the journals databases found on the [Business Subject Help](#) pages instead.

1. Go to [e-journals by title](#) page or enter:

2. You will be taken to the Brookes Login screen where you enter your student/staff number and your Brookes password (tip: the same one you use for email and PIP)

3. Type in the **journal title** (*not the article title*), e.g. **“management decision”** and use quotation marks to retrieve exact title otherwise your results will include everything with management or decision somewhere in the title.

4. Click on the link that covers the years you want as Emerald, the journal supplier, has divided their holdings into **Backfiles** and **Emerald Management Plus**. Don't click on

the link for the Proquest Health Management database. The date coverage is not so lengthy and the current year is not covered.

- You are then taken to the journal's page where every year and issue of the journal **Management decision** is listed. Every publisher's pages will look different, but you can select the year you want and use the volume and issue numbers to find the article you are looking for.
