An active inter-library lending scheme operates both locally and nationally giving users access to material held at other libraries here and abroad.

C A S S O N L I B R A R Y

after Dr. Elizabeth Casson, M.D., D.P.M., O.B.E.

Dr. Casson was a pioneer in the field of occupational therapy in this country and founded Dorset House, the first school of occupational therapy in the United Kingdom, in 1930.

The audiovisual room is to be known as the

D E N N I S O N R O O M

after Mr. Harry L. Dennison, M.A.

Mr. Dennison was a member of the school's staff from 1955 to 1986, and served as Bursar for the last nineteen of those years. He took a particular interest in the development of audiovisual aids and computers.
