Dear Professor Hoggart,

It was nice to meet you on Friday. I think that the lunch was fairly successful but it is a pity that the judges did not have more time to talk to each other. I am so sorry that everything was such a rush for you.

I meant to ask you on Friday to let me have a note of your expenses so that Bookers can reimburse you. If you could let me know I will put a cheque in the post to you, and also could you let me know how you would like the judges' fee to be paid (as there may be a tax problem)?

The books are in the post to you under separate cover, but for the moment I enclose the other judges' commands as far as they go, and a list of the books proposed for the judges' consideration by publishers who have already submitted two copies of their books.
